Lausanne is known as the Olympic Capital as it is the home of the headquarters of the International Olympic Committee and many international sports federations. Located in the French-speaking part of Switzerland, this vibrant and cosmopolitan city is about 60km from Geneva International Airport and easily connected by train.

course registration and academic information

Courses

Bachelor exchange students can only take courses in the 2nd and/or 3rd year of the Bachelor program (undergraduate).

To attend Master courses (graduate), exchange students must have completed a Bachelor's degree or a minimum of 180 ECTS in Management and/or Economics.

The courses in the Master of Accounting, Control and Finance (MScCCF) and in the Master in Sustainable Management & Technology (SMT) are not open to exchange students.

Some courses may require specific prerequisites and the approval of the Professor.

All HEC students are strongly recommended to have a personal laptop computer.

Courses outside HEC Lausanne

Exchange students registered at HEC Lausanne are allowed to take courses in another faculty of UNIL, but most courses must be taken at HEC Lausanne, the main faculty where the student is enrolled.

A limited number of courses are also open at the Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL), upon request by the student before or at the beginning of the semester, directly to the department concerned.

Registration

Students must register for courses/exams during the 3rd and 4th weeks of the semester.

Exchange students are expected to take their exams during the official exam session under the same conditions as regular students.

Format of examinations

Written, oral, seminar or ENEP (Onsite digital exams)

Full time course load

30 ECTS per semester 14 weeks of classes

Transcripts of records

An official transcript is sent by e-mail to the exchange coordinator of the home university about ten days after the end of the examination session.

languages

Language of instruction

Courses at the Bachelor level are taught in French with a selection of courses in English. At the Master's level, courses are mainly taught in English.

Language requirements

Exchange students are not required to pass any language proficiency test. A minimum level of B2 according to the «Common European Framework of Reference for Languages» is required in French and/or English depending on the language of instruction of the course attented by the student.

French classes



health insurance

As health and accident insurance is mandatory in Switzerland, foreign students must have an insurance coverage that complies with Swiss regulations. If a foreign health and accident insurance does not offer the minimum coverage required by Swiss law, exchange students will have to contract a Swiss health and accident insurance for international students. European students can benefit from the minimum coverage required by Swiss law if they have a European Health Insurance Card.

living costs

The average budget a student needs to live in Lausanne is around CHF 1'950 per month (incl. CHF 600 to 800 per month for accommodation). This amount includes food, personal effects, housing, health and accident insurance, books and school supplies.

accommodation

UNIL works closely with the Fondation Maisons pour Etudiants Lausanne (FMEL), which welcomes over 3'500 students at 14 sites, mainly in the greater Lausanne area.

UNIL tries as much as possible to secure accommodation for all exchange students in an FMEL hall of residence. However, since FMEL has a limited number of places available, UNIL cannot unfortunately guarantee housing for all exchange students and priority is given to those coming from overseas.

It is therefore recommended that exchange students consider other housing options on the private rental market at the same time. If needed, UNIL and EPFL run a joint accommodation database reserved exclusively for students.

Bachelor students

If you are in the 2nd or 3rd year of a Bachelor's or Licence's program, you may take courses in the 2nd or 3rd year of the Bachelor program in Economics and/or Management, except for the courses Business English, English for Studying Economics, the individual project and the internships.

Master students

If you are in the 1st or 2nd year of a Master's program (4th or 5th year undergraduate) and provided you have acquired a minimum of 180 ECTS in Management and/or Economics, you may take courses in the 1st or 2nd year of the Master's program and possibly in the 2nd or 3rd year of the Bachelor's program, with the exceptions above.

The courses in the Master of Accounting, Control and Finance (MScCCF) and in the Master in Sustainable Management & Technologies (SMT) are not open to exchange students.
