

Students with **non-EU citizenship** we recommend to send the applications earlier as visa procedures will take several months. After receiving an official nomination, we will send further information to the students.

Nominated students send the following documents by e-mail to international@htw-dresden.de:

- [Application for admission to the study program](#), signed by student and home coordinator
- Learning Agreement (course selection approved and signed by home university coordinator)
- **Resume/CV** (in English or German)
- **Transcript of Records** (overview of grades, in English or German)
- **Proof of language proficiency** (proof of the language the student will be studying in, English and/or German at level B1/B2)
- **Proof of health insurance** (Two-sided copy of the **European Health Insurance card (EHIC)** if the student is an **EU/EEA/CH** citizen which needs to be valid for the entire duration of the stay. Citizens from **outside the EU/EEA/CH** will have to sign up with a **German statutory health insurance** upon arrival in Dresden.)
- **up-to-date passport photo** (for the HTW student ID card, minimum size of 180x240 pixels in JPEG, PNG or GIF format, view from the front, neutral background)

Once accepted, the students will be provided with further information: they will receive an admission letter and other practical information.

ONLINE LEARNING AGREEMENT (only for Erasmus exchange!)

All **Erasmus+ exchange students** need to create the Learning Agreement completely digitally via <https://learning-agreement.eu/> as Online Learning Agreement (OLA). They can find instructions on how to do this here: [Online Learning Agreement](#).

SEMESTER FEE

There is **no tuition fee** at HTW Dresden, but a **semester fee** is charged (approx. 315 EUR). The semester fee includes contributions to the student union, the student council and the [semester ticket](#). With the semester ticket, students are mobile in the greater Dresden area by bus, tram, ferry and local trains. In addition, students can travel free of charge throughout Saxony on suburban trains and local trains.
