No Free Mover Mobility Possible

Since 1 March 2019 it is no longer possible to study as a free mover at the University of Mannheim. This is due to an amendment of the Regulations on Admission and Enrollment (ZullmmaO) of the University of Mannheim from 27 February 2019.

RECOMMENDED LANGUAGE SKILLS

Students must either be proficient in German OR have an advanced level of English (at least B2 according to the *Common European Framework of Reference for Languages*, i.e. equivalent to TOEFL iBT 80/IELTS 6.0).

The University of Mannheim reserves the right to deny admission into courses for students who do not have the requested level. We will not ask students to submit language tests for their application. However, we expect the home university to make sure their students have the required language proficiency.

International Summer Academy:

The International Summer/Winter Academy is a four-week intensive language course, which includes seminars on German culture and society.

Online German Language and Culture Courses

During the semester

The International Office offers online German language and culture courses during the semester for a small administrative fee (€15* per course). There are a range of German courses, including general language courses at different levels, and specific German culture courses (e.g. German Film History, The Political System of the Federal Republic of Germany, etc.).

As a rule, students can take a maximum of 3 courses per semester.



In order to cover the costs of student services, students enrolled at a German university – including exchange students – have to pay a semester fee. The fee currently amounts to €110.30* per semester.

Kindly note that all exchange students need to pay this fee in order to be enrolled.

Support for Students with Disabilities and Chronic Illnesses

The Commissioner and Counselor for students with disabilities and chronic illnesses supports students with special accommodations. If students have any health restrictions, they need to check the "Special Needs" box during their online application.

Buddy Program

Exchange students have the opportunity to be matched with a local student for support. In order to do so, they have to check the corresponding box in our online portal during the application.



HOUSING

Pick-up Service

Students can arrange an individual pick-up with their buddy. The International Office is only a short walk from the main train station.

Student Housing

Students can apply for student residences or look for a room on the private market.

For exchange students from overseas, we offer a very limited number of places in our offcampus student residences: single bedrooms in shared flats vary from €315* – €440*, single apartments from €365* – €440*. There are furnished rooms (shared kitchen and bathroom) in several residences in different areas of Mannheim.

Rooms on the private market start at €300. After being accepted by the University of Mannheim, the student will receive the link and personal password for our student portal Portal², along with detailed information on the private housing market.

EU members

Students from EU countries are exempt from having to purchase German health insurance if they present the EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) prior to enrollment.

UK

Students from the UK are exempt from having to purchase German health insurance if they present the GHIC (Global Health Insurance Card) prior to enrollment.

Non-EU members

We strongly recommend to all our exchange students from non-EU countries to purchase a German statutory health insurance. Students have the opportunity to buy German health insurance prior to their arrival in Mannheim. It costs about €110* per month (standard price for students by all health insurance providers).

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Citizens of the EU and of the EFTA (i.e. Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland) do not need a student visa.

Citizens from the following countries do not need a student visa. They need to apply for a German residence permit at the respective Foreigners' Registration Office in Germany: Australia, Canada, Israel, Japan, New Zealand, South Korea, United Kingdom, and USA.

Citizens of the following countries do not need a student visa as long as there is no intention to take up any gainful/paid employment before or after the studies: Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco, and San Marino.

Non-EU citizens who are enrolled at an EU university (except Ireland and Denmark) do not need to apply for a German residence permit if they study in Germany for less than 360 days according to the EU directive 2016/801, the "REST-directive" for researchers and students.

However, students need to hand in documents at the International Office as soon as they receive an email on it from our office. Otherwise enrollment as an exchange student will, regrettably, not be possible.

Students from all other countries should obtain a visa as soon as they receive their letter of acceptance for the University of Mannheim.





A Smooth Start

We know that the first few weeks in a foreign country can be challenging. The staff and student assistants in the International Office are here to support you while you settle into your new surroundings. Don't worry; you will get to know the campus sooner than you think.

Personal Support

While filling in your application, you can ask to be matched with a local student through the Buddy Program. Usually, your buddy will have already been abroad or is planning to go abroad and can relate to your experiences. Being familiar with the city and the university, your buddy can answer your questions on student life in Mannheim. Depending on your schedule, you can attend the numerous "Buddy Events"

together, or just meet for coffee in the city. The Buddy Program is also an excellent opportunity to get to know Germany's diverse culture.

Immerse Yourself

Our orientation sessions and campus tours during the Welcome Week give you a general idea of what student life in Mannheim is like. Additionally, we provide practical information on organizing your stay and arrange activities, such as an international dinner, and cultural trips throughout the semester. International student organizations organize many fun events, from city visits or weekend trips away to running dinners. You can show your talent at the "Mannheim's Got Talent" show, enjoy "Breakfast & Movie", or meet local families to learn more about the German way of life.

LEARNING GERMAN

Pre-semester Courses

Four-week, intensive German language courses for all levels of proficiency are offered before the semester starts, either during the International Summer Academy, which takes place in August, or the International Winter Academy, which takes place in January. In addition to the language courses, you can also sign up for excursions and seminars on German life and culture. Attending the academy is also a great way to make friends and settle in before the semester starts.

German Language and Culture Courses

During the semester, the University of Mannheim provides German courses for all levels of proficiency as well as specialized language courses on topics relating to business, culture, or politics, such as the German financial market, German art through the ages, or the political or sociocultural system of Germany.

Tandem Language Partner

Of course, you can also learn German outside of the classroom, and by using our Tandem Partner Search Portal, you can find a conversation partner to practice with.





The inventor Karl Drais started his famous **first ride** in front of the **palace**.




WHY THE UNIVERSITY OF MANNHEIM?

 If they still might choose courses beyond this list, I'll have to check that on a case-by-case
 basis with the other coordinators.

What's more:

• As the English-taught module offer on Bachelor level is somewhat limited, there might be the option for Bachelor students to sit in Master level classes.
