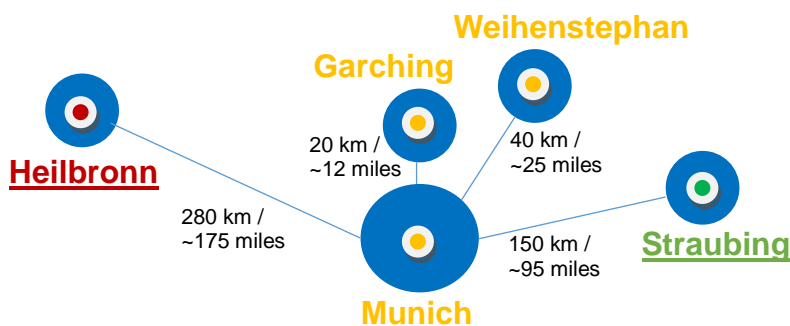

### Nomination for Partner Institutions

All relevant information with further instruction for the online nomination will be sent via email to our partners in March (for winter semester) and September (for summer semester). Your students are free to choose the campus. Please inform us about their decision via the nomination. It is not possible to change the campus during the exchange period.

### Application Process for Prospective Incoming Exchange Students

After an acknowledgement-e-mail from TUM, students apply within our application period as mentioned on the [TUM Global & Alumni website for incoming students](#). You are free to choose one of our TUM SoM campus. We will be informed about your decision via your home university's nomination. However, it is not possible to change the campus during the exchange period. Applications need to be done online & via e-mail and should include the following documents:

The applications should include the following documents:

1. Online application form
2. When completing the online form in the applicant portal, please follow the instructions on the first page of the form. Important: Online applications submitted after the application deadline will not be considered.
3. One-page letter of motivation (either in German or English)
4. Curriculum vitae (either in German or English)
5. Learning Agreement / Study plan (courses students want to attend at TUM)
6. Transcript of records (all grades attained at university)
7. Document listing the courses students are attending in their current semester (and therefore are not yet listed in the transcript).
8. An official language certificate (confirmation) for English and/or German (B2 CEF). The home university can issue this confirmation.

## Visa Requirements/ Residence Permit Application

---

<b>Entry Regulations</b>	Applicants from EU/EFTA nations as well as some other nations do not need a visa to study in Germany. Applicants from non-EU nations normally need a visa to study in Germany. In order to find out if they need a visa and how to apply, they must contact the embassy or consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany in their home country. Application processing times can vary greatly depending on volume of applications and the applicant's home country. It is recommended to submit the complete application at least two months prior to the student's departure. <b>Please note:</b> Students cannot travel to Germany on a tourist visa, since this cannot be changed into a student visa. Students that are in Germany on a tourist visa are not entitled to study there.

## Health Insurance

---

<b>Are students required to get health insurance?</b>	Health insurance is compulsory in Germany. Students cannot register at TUM without proof of German national insurance. To ensure that coverage is sufficient to meet German national standards, it is recommended that students purchase an in-country medical insurance plan. Travel insurances are not accepted.

## Banking

<b>Do students have to open a bank account while studying in Germany?</b>	It is highly advisable to open a bank account in Germany. German banks offer accounts free of charge for students. Debit cards from German banks are accepted throughout Europe.
<b>What are acceptable credit cards in Germany?</b>	In Munich, all major credit cards are accepted. However, not all stores take credit cards; some shops only accept cash payments. In smaller cities and towns outside of Munich, credit cards are usually not accepted.

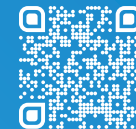

Our international student body enriches the modern campus and enables you to get in contact with people from all over the world.



## Campus Straubing

With the focus on sustainability, our state-of-the art Campus Straubing brings to life the connection between management studies and the natural sciences. The familial environment at the modern campus allows for a close interaction between students and professors.

## Courses and lectures

Exchange students can attend all courses, lectures and seminars offered by the TUM School of Management. However, the number of participants is limited for some courses. In this case, prior application is necessary. TUM School of Management offers a great number of courses taught in English. Students have to choose which campus they want to visit prior to their arrival and cannot commute between them.

It is required that at least 60% of your course choice has to be offered by TUM School of Management. However, it is also possible to attend some courses (but not more than 40%) at other TUM Schools.

The credit system ECTS is used at TUM. The workload per semester for a fulltime TUM-student is 30 ECTS. We recommend taking 15 - 20 ECTS to our exchange students.
