

CONFERENCE ON DATA JOURNALISM: OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

The **JOULE Project** is organizing its first conference on data for journalism, on the **10th of November 2023**. The event will take place in Lisbon, at Nova Information Management School (Nova IMS), Universidade Nova de Lisboa. During the conference, there will be a **“Best Poster Competition”**, where all attendees can vote for the poster they like the most. The winner will receive a certificate for the best poster at the end of the conference.

If you are interested in submitting a poster, please check the following **rules**:

- The poster should have scientific and accurate text, supported with key visuals, charts, and illustrations.

The poster should have a clear message about the research, how it was done, and why it is important. We are looking for innovative ideas on the following:

- The posters should have one or more of the following subjects:
 - Data Journalism;
 - Data Science for journalism;
 - Fake news detection using Data Science;
 - Data Analytics for Journalism;
 - Data Storytelling in journalism;
 - Modern communication and Social Sciences based on data.
- And other related fields. Some examples could be on the following topics:
 - The state of data journalism in your country or region;
 - How data science and journalism can benefit from each other;
 - How data visualization can influence the work of a journalist;
 - Which tools are common for storytelling in journalism;
 - Using open data in journalism;
 - Doing research on data journalism;
 - Among others.
- Format of the posters:
 - The standard size for posters is A0 841 x 1189 mm.
 - The digital poster should be in PDF format.
 - The resolution for the images of the digital poster should be 300 dpi, minimum. Lower than this, might result in images with less detail, affecting the quality of the poster.
 - Word font size should be big enough to allow it to be legible from a distance of about 2 meter's
