Academic matters

Courses for exchange students	At least 2/3 of the courses should be selected from one study field at the School of Science. The remaining 1/3 can be taken from other Schools of Technology in Aalto University, as long as the prerequisites are met.
Interdisciplinary studies	Exchange students are not allowed to take courses from the School of Arts, Design and Architecture or the School of Business, except for cross-school courses, universi- ty wide studies and interdisciplinary studies.
	Interdisciplinary studies include e.g. <u>Aalto Ventures Program (AVP)</u> courses and <u>Aaltonaut courses</u> . AVP courses cover important aspects of entrepreneurship: lead- ership, design thinking, finance, innovation, start-ups, prototyping, storytelling and much more. Aaltonaut courses are Bachelor level interdisciplinary product develop- ment courses recommended for students from all academic backgrounds.
	There are some changes in the course selection every year, the study programmes are updated during the summer. Students must be prepared to make changes in their study plans upon arrival.

	Regardless of study level, exchange students can choose both Bachelor and Master level courses, provided that the prerequisites are met. The majority of courses of- fered in English are on the Master level.

Aalto University Applying

The home university should nominate students to exchanges-sci@aalto.fi with the following information: student's name, exchange term, email address and intended study field in Aalto University. There is no set nomination deadline, but nominations should preferably be sent at least two weeks before the application deadline.
April 30: Deadline for applications for the next autumn term and academic year
October 15: Deadline for applications only for the next spring term
Please verify the dates online.
Nominated students receive application instructions and a link to the online applica- tion by email. Attachments are uploaded to the online application, no hard copies are required.

Academic requirements: Aalto University strongly recommends at least two to three years of Bachelor's studies before arrival.
Language requirements: Exchange students need either an official language test certificate or a certificate from an English language teacher/professor stating that the student has sufficient language skills to study in English in their subject area (minimum B2 in CEFR level). Only students, whose mother tongue is English or who study in English-medium programme in a university in Australia, Canada, Hong Kong, Ireland, Singapore, the UK, or in USA, are exempted from providing a language certificate.

Application results The application results will be ready within six weeks after the application deadline.





Practical matters

Accommodation	Aalto University does not own any student housing nor have housing services to offer. Main housing providers are HOAS (Foundation for Student Housing in the Helsinki Region) and AYY (Aalto University Student Union).
	Students must apply for housing themselves according to the instructions given by Aalto University. The housing situation in Helsinki metropolitan area is difficult, especially in the autumn. Aalto University cannot guarantee student accommodation for all exchange students. For more information, please see Housing for exchange students website.
Visa/residence permit	Citizens of non-EU/EEA countries must apply for visa or residence permit. Non-EU/ EEA students are advised to start the residence permit application process imme- diately after receiving the letter of admission. <u>For more information on applying for</u> <u>residence permit, please see Finnish Immigration Service (MIGRI) website</u> .
	Citizens of EU Member States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland do not need a residence permit for Finland but must register right of residence in Finland if non-stop stay exceeds 3 months. <u>For more information on registering an EU citizen's</u> <u>right of residence, please see Finnish Immigration Service (MIGRI) website</u> .
Insurance and health care	Students must personally cover the costs if they become ill in Finland, therefore all exchange students must have insurance that is valid for the whole duration of the stay in Finland.
	Students who apply for Finnish residence permit must take out private insurance that covers medical and drug expenses. For more information on eligible insurance for residence permit application, please see Finnish Immigration Service (MIGRI) website.
	In addition to private insurance, EU-students should take European Health In- surance Card (EHIC) with them to Finland. By presenting the European Health Insurance Card, one can prove right to necessary medical treatment in another EU or EEA country and in Switzerland. The card must be valid for the whole duration of stay in Finland.
	Please note that exchange students do not have access to Finnish Student Health Services (FSHS).
	The emergency number in Finland is 112.
Living expenses	According to current estimate, students need 800 euros per month for living expenses. The total living expenses depend greatly on the type of accommodation. For the breakdown of estimated monthly expenses, please see this website.
Student Union Membership	AYY (Aalto University Student Union) membership is optional but highly recom- mended for all exchange students. AYY membership is mandatory for students who live in AYY apartments. <u>For more information on benefits, please see AYY website</u> .
